

#1- That this Affiant #1, Detective Arthur Walkley #589, hereinafter referred to as "this Detective", is a sworn member of the Connecticut State Police and is presently assigned to the Western District Major Crime Squad, under the command of Lieutenant David DeVecchia. This Detective has been a member of the Connecticut State Police for approximately sixteen (16) years and currently holds the rank of Detective, and at all times mentioned herein was acting in his official capacity as such. This Detective has knowledge of the facts and circumstances hereinafter related as a result of his own investigative efforts, as well as those of other officers and credible witnesses, who have relayed their findings to this Detective.

#2-That on Monday, March 10th, 2014, Detectives with Western District Major Crime, were requested to assist with a "Suspicious Fire" investigation, which had occurred on Saturday March 8th, 2014. The incident was called into Troop-B at approximately 1551 hours. The fire involved a private residence located at #102 Simons Pond Road, in the Town of Colebrook, Connecticut. Troopers, Colebrook Fire Department, and mutual aid fire companies were dispatched to the scene. According to filed incident reports, Trooper Elovirta, #1003, was the first (1st) to arrive on scene. Upon his arrival, Trooper Elovirta described the residence as being, "Fully involved". Trooper Elovirta further described that, "The large fireplace and chimney were still standing and several timbers that made up the walls were still standing but that was all".

#3-That on March 8th, 2014, the Connecticut State Police Fire and Explosion Investigation Unit was dispatched to the scene to assist the local Colebrook Fire Marshall, Marc Melanson, with the investigation into the "Origin and Cause" of the fire. On March 16th, this Detective received the following conclusion from Detective Makuc regarding the "Origin and Cause" of the fire:

That based upon the examination of the fire scene, witness statements, subsequent investigation, and a peer review, Detective Makuc, #885, and the investigative team concluded that the fire that occurred at #102 Simon Pond Road, in the Town of Colebrook, Connecticut on March 8th, 2014 originated within the interior of the structure, specifically on the first (1st) floor level. No accidental or natural potential competent ignition sources were reported to be present or located within this structure. As a result, Detective Makuc, #885, and the investigative team concluded that this fire was the result of the intentional act of the ignition, by human hands, of ordinary combustibles by an open flame consistent with a match or a lighter. The cause of this fire is ruled INCENDIARY.

#4- That on March 9th, 2014, Trooper Strolis spoke with James C. Jonson (DOB [REDACTED] and his wife Arlene Jonson (DOB [REDACTED]) of #151 Mcclave Road Colebrook, Connecticut, regarding this investigation. Mr. Jonson provided a sworn written statement to Trooper Strolis in which he stated the following:

Yesterday, 03/08/14, my wife Arlene and I decided to take a walk as the weather was going to be nice. We ventured off around 12:45 P.M. in our car for our hike. We drove our car down to the intersection of Cobb City and Simons Pond Road, parked the car and hiked in. On the way in for our hike it was rather uneventful; we had no interaction with any persons as we hiked the trail. On the way out at the bottom of the hill we ran into a guy dressed in a light hunting jacket operating a dark green colored ATV coming towards us. As the guy came towards us we moved out of the way, he gave us a wave and a nod and kept on down the path. As we continued on our way back to the car we passed by an old abandoned cabin that has been dilapidated for years. As we walked by the cabin we both heard a noticeable clink sound, and at first we thought nothing of it and kept walking. When we walked by the front door that is rather overgrown we didn't see anything and just kept on walking back to the car. When we got down to our car, I was trying to unlock the doors on the car when we both noticed a person walking down the road from the direction of the cabin we had just passed. As the person got closer we noticed that it was a white male wearing a New York Giants winter coat that I believe was a dark color. As the person got closer we noticed that the person was a white male, roughly 5 feet 4 inches to 5 feet 6 inches tall, wearing what looked like sweat pants and maybe a hoody under the jacket as the hood was up and over his head. The male never really looked at us; he seemed to keep his head down as he walked. We never had any real interaction with the male, maybe a nod as he passed us by. As he passed we noticed that the jacket he was wearing had the New York Giants emblem and writing on the back. If I were to guess, I recall the white male looked like he was a teenager, but I couldn't say for certain as we didn't really pay that much attention to him. The white male just walked out in normal fashion. Once we got in the car we headed back home and the white male was heading in the same direction that we were on Cobb City Road. At the time nothing appeared suspicious about the male so we thought nothing of it. It wasn't until today when my cousin John Burrows called me on the telephone and informed me about the fire down at the Lemandquist property, the cabin that we had walked past the day earlier. I informed my cousin about the person we had seen walking and he said that he was going to pass it on to the First Selectman, Thomas Mckeon. John later called us back and told us that he had passed it on and said that we might be receiving a call from the State Police. Shortly after our conversation Trooper Strolis arrived at our doorstep.

#5- That based on the above description, provided by Jonson, on Tuesday, March 11th, 2014 this Detective, Detective Wrightson and Sergeant Covello responded to Northwestern Regional High School, District #7, located at #100 Battistoni Drive in the Town of Winsted, and spoke with the Principal Kenneth Chichester. Mr. Chichester was advised that WDMC was conducting an investigation into the recent Colebrook fire and that witnesses had observed a white male, possibly a teenager, wearing a "New York Giants" jacket had been observed walking away from the scene just prior to the fire being called into police. It was requested of Mr.

Chichester that he disseminate the information to his faculty and if anybody had any information that may be of assistance to contact WDMC. On March 11th, 2014, shortly after leaving Northwestern Regional High School, Mr. Chichester contacted WDMC with information regarding the case. Mr. Chichester advised that they had a student by the name of Owen Lovejoy, who is seventeen (17) years six (6) months old who is known to wear a "New York Giants" jacket, lives on Cobb City Road, and who has recently been behaving and performing poorly in school. Mr. Chichester explained that one (1) of Owen's teachers had a large package of candy taken from her desk. When Owen was confronted about the missing item from the teacher's desk, Owen denied any knowledge. The bag of candy was subsequently located within Owen's locker by administrators and Owen still denied taking the item. Mr. Chichester went on to state that Owen was not in school today (March 11th) due to illness.

#6- That on March 11th, 2014, at approximately 1445 hours this Detective, Detective Wrightson and Sergeant Covello arrived at #30 Cobb City Road, in an attempt to speak with Owen and his mother (Kathleen Riiska-Lovejoy). Nobody answered the door, or appeared to be home. Shortly after our arrival a young female was observed walking down the driveway to the residence. After identifying ourselves to the female, the female provided her name to Detectives, Jane Lovejoy (DOB [REDACTED]), and stated that she was the sister of Owen. Jane agreed to go inside to see if anybody was home. Jane returned shortly thereafter and confirmed that nobody was home and that her mother had taken Owen for a medical appointment. Jane attempted to contact her mother without success. Jane then was able to make contact with her father, Glen R. Lovejoy, MD., at his workplace. Sergeant Covello spoke with Dr. Lovejoy and explained that Detectives were interested in speaking with him and Owen about the fire on Simon Pond Road. Dr. Lovejoy advised that he would be leaving work and that he would be home in approximately one (1) hour to meet with Detectives.

#7- That on March 11th, 2014, at approximately 1610 hours we returned to the residence. Dr. Lovejoy met this Detective, Detective Wrightson, and Sergeant Covello at the side entrance to the residence and invited Detectives in to the family room of the residence. Seated in the room were Owen and his mother, Kathleen. The family members were advised that WDMC was investigating the fire which had occurred on Simon Pond Road. All of the family members acknowledged that they were aware of the fire and advised that they had spoken to a Trooper who had knocked on their door about their knowledge of the incident. wearing at the time of the incident. Owen and his parents acknowledged and agreed to Owen providing a statement and to giving consent for the seizure of the items involved in the incident. I took the matches and walked down Cobb City Road to Simons Pond Road. I entered the residence through the front entrance and lit the papers that were on the floor by the fireplace. I believe I needed to use two (2) matches in the living room area and then I used one (1) match to light papers that were in the last room, I believe was a bedroom, down on the right. I then walked back through the living room and saw that the fire was going in the living room. I then left the residence through the front door, the one I had entered through, then walked home. I do not know what caused me to go and start the fire. I was alone when I went to the residence and nobody was with me when I lit the house on fire. I went and did this sometime around mid-afternoon, I'm not sure of the exact time. Approximately 30 minutes to 45 minutes after I returned home I heard the emergency sirens arriving at the scene. After thinking about it I may have started the fire at the house because the house has always been scary to me. I used to have nightmares about the house and used to wake up sweating.

CHIEF COMPLAINT AND REASON FOR ADMISSION:

The patient was admitted to Donnelly 2 North from Hartford Hospital emergency department on voluntary status. The patient presented with positive auditory hallucination and suicidal ideation to crash his car or drown himself. He presented with disorganized and racing thoughts, increased anxiety and increased depression. The patient denied homicidal ideation or visual hallucinations. The patient reported he held a knife to his neck and was daring himself to cut his neck. He verbalized and recognized his behaviors as not right. The patient verbalized that for the first time he was beginning to realize that he is a different person around different people and it is hard to remember who I am supposed to be around certain people. Upon admission the patient appeared tearful at times.

In the initial session with social worker, the patient presented with high anxiety and was shaking and tearful during interaction. He presented rambling on his process and reason for admission. He denied suicidal ideation, homicidal ideation, auditory hallucinations and visual hallucinations at admission. This was the patient's first inpatient hospitalization, and he had no current outpatient services at the time of admission. The patient did have interaction with Wellmore Behavioral Health EMPS Services with C. Brunette, MFT.

HOSPITAL COURSE:

The patient was treated on the unit for psychiatric care by Dr. Mirela Loftus. Please see Dr. Loftus' supervisory discharge summary for information in regards to medication management, rationale, as well as any other medical and psychiatric issues felt to be of importance for this patient by Dr. Loftus.

The patient was seen for individual, group and family treatment by the undersigned. Upon admission Owen began therapy services with Bau Chau Van, LCSW. Upon Bau Chau's departure from the IOL, the patient was transferred to this writer. While working with Bau Chau, the patient and his parents engaged in family sessions to discuss coping techniques, strengths and concerns, and discharge disposition planing. It was decided upon with the family, patient, and Bau Chau that partial hospitalization at Charlotte Hungerford would be appropriate. Bau Chau discussed these options with the family and patient and made a referral for this PHP service. During the first session with this writer and patient the patient presented as insightful with bright affect and engaged in dialogue. He stated I feel really good and was able to dialogue about a major revelation regarding his need to decrease his activities to limit stress. The patient was able to express this in a family session and

identified reasons as to why he took on so many activities such as increasing his social life and the feeling of being addicted to adding new activities. In family session the patient was articulate and insightful and worked with this clinician to communicate with his family and build coping skills. The patient's family appeared appropriate in meetings and adequately addressed ways to support patient. The patient actively participated in homework given by this clinician and was observed working during free time towards his goals.

Both of the patient's parents were readily available to take an active role in treatment. Mother and father appeared supportive and gave space for patient to express himself while also helping him to hypothesize and brainstorm. The patient's sister was also an active participant in treatment and the patient stated that he had a close and supportive relationship with her.

Over the course of his hospitalization the patient took part in a variety of therapeutic groups within the milieu. He easily interacted with his peers and followed unit instruction very well. A major stressor for the patient as reported by him was the amount of activities and commitments he had made outside of the unit. The patient reported he was in a band with his friends as well as being involved in several extracurricular groups at school. The patient worked to make a list of what activities he could eliminate from his schedule and made steps in notifying friends and peers that he would need to end certain activities. The patient identified that with a decrease in extracurriculars he would be able to manage his stress more easily and feel more comfortable.

During the course of his hospitalization the patient was able to identify many different coping skills to implement to control his anxiety and stress. The patient exercised deep breathing, meditation, and some Buddhist principles to help control his anxiety. The patient felt that he could implement these coping skills when at home in order to address his anxiety once he left the unit. The patient took an active role in his treatment and was able to acknowledge that both therapy and medication management had helped him on the unit to control his anxiety and anxiety attacks.

Following an increasingly improved mood as presented by the patient, self-reports of decreased suicidal ideation and self-harm, increased communication between the patient and his family, treatment services were in place and plans were made to discharge the patient.

POST HOSPITAL DISCHARGE PLAN:

The following plans were in place at the time of discharge:

1. The patient was to start PHP at Charlotte Hungerford in Torrington, Connecticut. His intake appointment was set for Wednesday, 09/04/2013 at 10:30 in the morning.

Owen is a 17yo male who presents for readmission to the Partial Hospital Program, accompanied by his mother, and as referred by Natchaug Hospital. Owen was admitted to Natchaug on 03/14/14 and discharged this morning. He was admitted due to bizarre behavior, including setting fire to an abandoned home in his neighborhood. Mother and Ct describe that since last admission to PHP, Ct was doing well and managing his anxiety and depression successfully for several months. In late January 2014 mom states his mood and behavior began to change and describes him as withdrawn, isolative, and irritable during that time. Ct was involved in uncharacteristic incidents, such as getting in an accident with another driver and fleeing the scene, making racial and sexual remarks at school, stealing candy from a teacher's desk and denying it, and later setting fire to a home, as aforementioned. Ct also displayed some changes in cognition such as memory loss, and at times could not recall simple directions. He denies AH/VH however he was observed at times laughing inappropriately or talking to himself- which he explains now is not in response to internal stimuli but his way of "rehearsing or practicing what he plans to say." He denies SIB/ SI/ HI. He denies substance use past or present. He feels that his mood has been mostly flat/ low and he denies anxiety or panic. He reports little memory of events leading up to setting fire to a home- and his mother observes that he had no insight or awareness at the time into his mood and behavioral changes. He denies manic symptoms/ elevated mood/ or significant mood changes. Since hospital admission and starting Risperidone 3mg daily, Ct's functioning has improved and mother feels he is presenting more at his baseline. He will be resuming school at Northwest Regional & and is scheduled to graduate this school year. He is currently prescribed Zoloft 100mg daily in addition to the Risperidone. Owen will resume PHP as of today with goals of: psychiatric stabilization, symptom management, developing insight and awareness into symptoms, med management, and updated psychiatric evaluation.


